Dear Rose:

This letter is written to request a \$50 per month increase in salary for Mr. Leo Dull. As you may recall, in January of this year we were authorized to employ Mr. Dull on a month-to-month contract basis at the rate of \$200 per month to be a working supervisor in the landscape maintenance area at the Western White House.

Mr. Dull works part-time for the Golfing Friends, overseeing the golf course. For this he is paid at the rate of \$900 per month (he was just given a \$100 per month increase). The balance of Mr. Dull's time is spent in working with and supervising Mr. Garcia (the President's personal gardener/handyman) and Mr. Martinez (Secret Service contracted gardener assigned to the compound).

Mr. Kalmbach recommends that Mr. Dull be given an increase of \$50 per month which will bring his compensation up to a monthly rate of \$250, to be paid out of the President's personal funds. Would you please advise me if we should effect this salary increase. If so, would an effective date of November 1, 1973 be acceptable and desirable? Please let me know if you need any additional information or if there is any way in which I can be of further assistance.





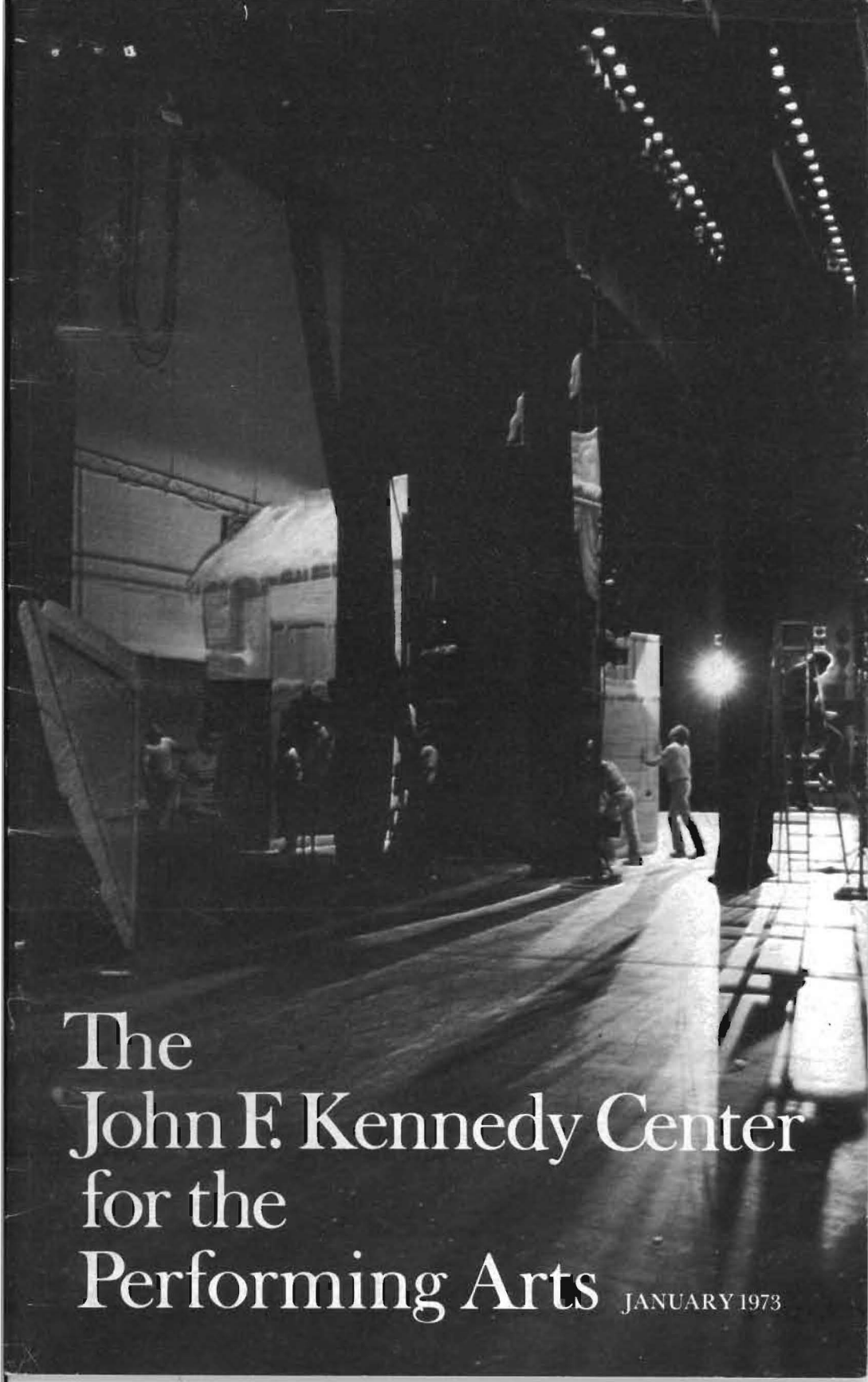
