SUBJECT:

FY 1973 Nuclear Weapons Deployment Authorization

The President has approved the Nuclear Weapons Deployment Authorization Planfor FY 1973 contained in the Department of Defense memorandum dated May 11, 1972.

The President agrees that the number of weapons shown reflect yearend authorizations with specific conditional deployments treated on a separate basis and that actual deployments against these authorizations will be controlled by the Secretary of Defense.

Any significant changes contemplated in actual overseas deployments within these authorizations should be submitted to the President for approval. The Secretary of Defense is authorized reasonable flexibility to manage and alter overseas nuclear weapons stockpile quantities during the course of the year as may be required by logistical considerations.

The President authorizes the Secretary of Defense in FY 1973 to:

- 1. Deploy nuclear weapons in the United States without limitation.
- 2. Deploy nuclear weapons to areas outside the United States up to the limits indicated in Appendices A, B, and C, hereto, with the provisions that:
- a. The end-FY 1973 total deployment authorization for each separate foreign country within each region and afloat (Appendix A), and the total authorization by category of weapon for each region and afloat (Appendix B) may not be exceeded by more than 10% in the event of unforeseen contingencies unless approved by the President.

- b. Weapons to be deployed under the specific conditions cited in Appendix C may be deployed as additive to existing authorizations for countries, regions and outside the U.S., except that:
- (1) Deployments of 155 mm projectiles for support of non-U.S. NATO units will be accompanied by a corresponding reduction in the authorization for these weapons with U.S. forces in West Germany.
- (2) The Secretary of Defense will determine at the appropriate time whether deployments in support of the Atomic Demolition Munition Program of Cooperation should be accompanied by corresponding increases in the total number of these weapons in NATO Europe.
- 3. Support non-U.S. forces in accordance with the units and numbers of weapons indicated in Appendix D hereto, subject to the following conditions:
- a. The provisions of NSAM 197 and NSAM 143, as amended by NSAM 370, concerning additional support for non-U.S. forces, continue to apply.
- b. Programs of Cooperation remain essentially the same as when Presidential approval was given.

c. Custodial arrangements and facilities requirements of the 42 NSAM 370 continue to apply.

The deployment authorization request for FY 1974 and projections for FY 1975 should be submitted for the President's approval in February, 1973, together with the stockpile approval request. In addition to the

type of information presented in Appendix A through E of the Secretary of Defense's FY 1973 deployment request, rationale should be provided for any significant changes in overseas or afloat deployments requested for FY 1974 or projected for FY 1975. The rationale should include a discussion of military objectives and capabilities affected by any such changes in proposed deployments. For new weapons systems requested to be deployed in support of U.S. or Allied forces during this period, the total deployment program and schedule should be shown.
