GE-SNECMA Jet Engine Joint Venture

The President has reviewed the issues bearing on the General Electric Company's license application together with agency positions on this subject.

The President has approved extension of the CF6-50A data license for one year. He has disapproved GE's export application for one XF101 engine core. In so doing, he has emphasized that the data to be exchanged under the extended CF6-50A license will be exclusive of data embodied in XF101 engine core technology.

The President directs that the Department of State inform the Government of France of the reasons underlying this decision.
