SUBJECT:

Nuclear Weapons Deployment Authorization for FY 74

The President has approved the Nuclear Weapons Deployment Authorization Plan for FY 74 contained in the Department of Defense memorandum, dated June 8, 1973.

The number of weapons authorized reflects year-end authorizations with specific conditional deployments treated on a separate basis. Actual deployments against these authorizations will be controlled by the Secretary of Defense. Any significant changes contemplated in actual overseas deployments within these authorizations should be submitted to the President for approval.

The President authorizes the Secretary of Defense in FY 74 to:

- -- Manage and alter overseas nuclear weapons stockpile quantities as may be required by logistical considerations.
 - -- Deploy nuclear weapons in the U.S. without limitation.
- -- Deploy nuclear weapons to areas outside the U.S. up to the limits indicated in Appendices A, B, and C, hereto, with the provision that:
- The end-FY 74 total deployment authorization for each separate foreign country or afloat (Appendix A), and the total authorization by category of weapons for each region or afloat (Appendix B) may be exceeded by no more than ten percent in the event of unforeseen contingencies unless approved by the President





- Weapons to be deployed under the specific conditions cited in Appendix C may be deployed as additive to existing authorizations for countries, regions and outside the U.S., except that:
- O Deployments of 155mm projectiles for support of non-U.S. NATO units will be accompanied by a corresponding reduction in the authorization for these weapons with U.S. forces in West Germany.
- O The Secretary of Defense will recommend at the appropriate time whether deployments in support of the Atomic Demolition Munition Program of Cooperation should be accompanied by corresponding increases in the total number of these weapons in NATO Europe.
- -- Support non-U.S. forces in accordance with the units and numbers of weapons indicated in Appendix D hereto, subject to the following conditions:
- The provisions of NSAM 197 and NSAM 143, as amended by NSAM 370, concerning additional support for non-U.S. forces, continue to apply.
- Programs of Cooperation remain essentially the same as when Presidential approval was given.
- Custodial arrangements and facilities requirements of NSAM 370 continue to apply.

Permissive Action Link (PAL) devices will continue to be installed in all weapons deployed to NATO Europe and The weapon/ yield restrictions of NSAM 143, as modified by NSAM 199 and NSAM 370, apply. In the Pacific region PALs will continue to be placed on all nuclear weapons deployed in and on By the end of FY 74, PALs will be placed on the ASW nuclear weapons deployed in the The replacement of the tactical bombs in the with PAL-equipped bombs will be accomplished by the end of CY 1974 or as soon thereafter as procurement of such bombs permits.





The deployment authorization request for FY 75 and projections for FY 76 should be submitted for the President's approval in February 1974 together with the stockpile approval request. Rationale should continue to be provided for any significant changes in overseas or afloat deployments requested as outlined in NSDM 178.


